CANADIAN PREMIERE OF SOFTIE ANNOUNCED AS OPENING NIGHT FILM FOR HOT DOCS 2020

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to announce that the Canadian premiere of Sam Soko's *Softie* (Kenya, Canada | 2020 | 96 min) has been announced as the opening night film for this year's Hot Docs Festival.

A complex portrait of an honourable man, *Softie* tells the story of Kenya's most provocative photojournalist, Boniface "Softie" Mwangi, as he campaigns against injustice, and the resulting impact this often has on his family. Determined to see an end to political corruption and the Britishimposed colonial-era tribalism that has divided Kenyans since before the country's independence, Softie raises the stakes and decides to enter the regional election. As he tries to run an honest campaign in a pay-to-play political landscape, his ideals are tested as he must choose between country and those closest to him.

"This year's opening night film is a perfect example of the outspoken, outstanding filmmaking that Hot Docs was founded to champion," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "A beautifully crafted story from an emerging filmmaking team, *Softie* has been part of several Hot Docs industry programs and truly showcases our mission to promote and support excellence in documentary filmmaking."

Softie has received support from many Hot Docs Industry initiatives. The project received funds from the Hot Docs-Blue Ice Group Doc Fund and Hot Docs Partners, participated in Hot Docs Deal Maker in 2017, and pitched at the 2018 Hot Docs Forum.

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SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS SPOTLIGHTS GRIPPING WORLD STORIES, FAMOUS FACES, AND REVOLUTIONARY MOMENTS IN POP CULTURE

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – This year's Special Presentations program features a captivating selection of world and international premieres, award winners from the recent international festival circuit and works by master filmmakers or featuring star subjects.

"Big ideas and bold filmmaking are a highlight of this year's Special Presentations program," said Shane Smith, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Championing globally important issues, compelling character studies and powerful personal stories, the films in this program are the documentaries the world will be paying attention to this year."

This year's *Special Presentations* program features profiles of renowned artists and famous faces, including Jamaican-American pop star Harry Belafonte, who takes over Johnny Carson's seat to create a revolutionary moment in television history in the international premiere of *The Sit-In: Harry Belafonte Hosts The Tonight Show*. We discover the complex genius of American multi-instrumentalist musician, composer, and bandleader Frank Zappa with the Canadian premiere of *Zappa*; and the Canadian premiere of *Mucho Mucho Amor* will introduce audiences to eccentric Puerto Rican astrologer and psychic Walter Mercado. Equal parts Oprah, Liberace and Mr. Rogers, you'll fall in with this over-the-top, gender nonconforming celebrity who charmed viewers for over 30 years before abruptly disappearing from the spotlight.

The Special Presentations program touches on a multitude of themes and subjects, including technology's rapid reshaping of our lives, pressing political stories, examinations of power and corruption, and explorations of gender through the trans experience.

In the Canadian premiere of *The Social Dilemma*, director Jeff Orlowski (*Chasing Ice*) and crew turn their cameras on Silicon Valley, exposing how computer algorithms can alter our thoughts and corrode our humanity. Informative and cautionary, the international premiere of *Coded Bias* shows the drastic ripple effect that occurs when technology discriminates through the story of an MIT researcher, who discovers that advanced facial recognition technology doesn't recognize Black faces.

An urgent report on democracy, the international premiere of *A Thousand Cuts* follows internationally acclaimed press-freedom fighter Maria Ressa as she navigates fake news punditry, bomb threats and arrest warrants to chronicle Philippine President Duterte's extrajudicial war on drugs and weaponization of social media. And from Academy Award-winning director Bryan Fogel, docu-thriller *The Dissident* takes a chilling look at the role technology played in the murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi at the Saudi consulate in Istanbul.

Further exposing the unpredictability of politics, *Larry Flynt for President* takes viewers back to the early 1980s, when the *Hustler* publisher cranked his propaganda machine into high gear after deciding to run for president. The Sundance Grand Jury Prize-winner *Boys State* explores notions of masculinity, race and human rights as it delves inside an elaborate program where a thousand Texas high school seniors go head to head in a mock campaign to try and create their own government.



Notorious British public relations and reputation management firm Bell Pottinger is the focus of *Influence*. Known for taking on a list of disreputable clients, the film chronicles how the company used fake news, weaponized communication and interference to spin a story. The North American premiere of *The Forum* presents an inside look of the World Economic Forum in Davos, where the most powerful leaders and thinkers gather, spotlighting fascinating conversations between personalities like Al Gore, Jair Bolsonaro and Greta Thunberg.

Featuring a who's who of trans subjects, *Disclosure: Trans Live on Screen* enlists some of the biggest names in the community—Laverne Cox, Lilly Wachowski, Yance Ford and Chaz Bono—to explore how on-screen stereotypes simultaneously reflect and manufacture our deepest anxieties about gender. And the world premiere of *Transhood* follows four trans kids in Kansas as they redefine coming-of-age on their own terms. Filmed over five years, we watch as they navigate obstacles and celebrate personal triumphs, with each of their journeys revealing how gender is reshaping perceptions of "the family next door" in America's heartland.

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NEW MARKERS PROGRAM RECOGNIZES DOCUMENTARIES PUSHING THE STRUCTURAL BOUNDARIES OF THE DOCUMENTARY FORM

Toronto, April 14, 2020— Hot Docs is pleased to announce the addition of the new film program Markers, which features boundary-pushing films taking liberties with the typical structure of documentary form. Named as a nod to the revolutionary work of acclaimed filmmaker Chris Marker, the program highlights filmmakers who are going against the grain and making their own mark on the genre with original projects. The Markers program includes four feature films, three mid-lengths and five shorts.

"An homage to documentary legend Chris Marker, and a celebration of filmmakers staking out new territory in non-fiction storytelling, the films featured in the inaugural Markers program push the documentary form in exhilarating, unpredictable ways," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs.

Films featured in this program include *Judy Versus Capitalism*, a bio doc about iconic second wave Canadian feminist, journalist and writer, Judy Reddick. With its six-part episodic framework, the film is shot in kinetic bursts of super 8 to reveal Reddick's life story, her struggle for a woman's right to choose and the challenge of neo-liberalism.

Making its Canadian premiere is the experimental film, *Trouble*. Taking an avant-garde approach to filming a documentary, the film follows director Mariah Garnett as she travels back to her native Ireland to reconcile her family's past after an infamous documentary about her Catholic/Protestant home forced her father to leave. With Garnett voicing her father in re-enactments and a transgender actor playing her mother, *Trouble* is an unconventional take on doc film that draws connections between political struggles, rebuilds family ties, and highlights the complexities of representation and the construction of identity.

The North American premiere of *If It Were Love* follows choreographer Gisèle Vienne's production *Crowd*, a radical, polyphonic dance show about the 90's rave scene, as it tours the world. With trance-like performances and intimate backstage moments, the film pushes experimental documentary and blurs the lines between real life and theatre. Winner of the Teddy Award at this year's Berlinale Film Festival, *If It Were Love* is an ecstatic exploration of love and violence, party and pain, raw emotions and queer sensuality.

The program will also feature the North American premieres of *Bile*, an experimental essay on disease and health that intertwines the director's story of her mother's cancer and death in post-Soviet Russia with a vast range of medical archives, establishing connections between physical disorders and fascism; and *Panquiaco*, which blends documentary and fiction to examine larger issues surrounding displacement and the effects of colonialism through the story of Cebaldo, an Indigenous man from a small village in Panama who returns home after working as a fisherman in Portugal for years.

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CANADIAN SPECTRUM COMPETITIVE PROGRAM FEATURES VITAL AND COMPELLING STORIES FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Toronto, April 14, 2020— Hot Docs is pleased to announce the 12 feature films and 11 shorts programmed in Canadian Spectrum, a competitive program showcasing the work of Canadian directors. With themes encompassing families and relationships, immigrant communities struggling with gentrification, and speaking truth to power to expose deep-seeded corruption, this year's slate of films spotlights critical stories told by Canada's own.

"Canada continues to deliver as a force in documentary storytelling, and this year's Canadian Spectrum films beautifully exemplify that," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Showcasing an exceptional array of emerging talent, alongside seasoned filmmakers, the stories they tell are bold, curious, engaging and as diverse as the country itself."

Canadian Spectrum includes the world premieres of: #Blessed, a revelatory peek inside Canada's fastest growing millennial church in Toronto; The Dawnsayer, a tragic yet uplifting story about an eccentric old man whose plans to save humanity from nuclear disaster rest in a bunker of buried school buses; There's No Place Like This Place, Anyplace, a look at Toronto's gentrification told through immigrant stories affected by the closure of discount store Honest Ed's; The Walrus and the Whistleblower, which tells a stranger-than-fiction tale of a MarineLand trainer turned whistleblower who sparks an online movement to end marine mammal captivity; and Under the Same Sun, a skillfully balanced exploration of humanity and hatred in the South Caucasus, a region plagued by aggressive nationalist movements.

The program also features: the North American premiere of *Prayer for a Lost Mitten*, a touching look at those coming to claim their belongings at the Montreal Metro's lost and found; and the Canadian premieres of *Dope is Death*, a look at the Black activists in the 1970s who introduced acupuncture into their communities as a treatment for drug addiction; and *Stateless*, which looks at a young attorney's grassroots campaign to protect citizenship rights when anti-Black legislation in the Dominican Republic strips them from people of Haitian descent.

Films rounding out the program include: *Don't Worry, The Doors Will Open*, a meditation on the uncertainties of life in post-Soviet Ukraine as reflected through the daily train commute of its citizens; *Eddy's Kingdom*, a bizarre tale of an entrepreneur's obsessive dream to build a Middle Eastern-themed amusement park on an island in the Okanagan Valley; *A Woman, My Mother*, the filmmaker's touching exploration of his mother and her secretive life; and *The World is Bright*, which follows an elderly Chinese couple confronting Canadian Government bureaucracy as they unravel the mysterious truth behind the death of their son.

All feature-length titles in this program are eligible to win the Best Canadian Feature Documentary Award, and the DGC Special Jury Prize — Canadian Feature Documentary Award. Directors in the Canadian Spectrum program with fewer than two previous feature film credits are also eligible to win the Emerging Canadian Filmmaker Award.

HOT DOCS HONOURS CANADIAN FILMMAKER RAYMONDE PROVENCHER WITH FOCUS ON RETROSPECTIVE

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to announce this year's Focus On retrospective, an annual program showcasing the work of a significant Canadian filmmaker, pays tribute to award-winning Canadian filmmaker Raymonde Provencher.

"Combining a journalist's tenacity with deep humanism, Raymonde Provencher is a formidable filmmaker and storyteller, whose genuine care for, and interest in, her subjects arises from her profound commitment to women and human rights," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "We're so thrilled to be able to spotlight her films with our Focus On program, a body of work that spans the globe and reflects some of its rarely covered stories with deep sincerity and compassion."

Films part of this year's Focus On retrospective include: *Café Désirs* (2015) a fascinating look at a generation of young, single Algerian men as they come of age in the ancient city of Constantine; *Crimes Without Honour* (2012), which follows four women of different faiths in Canada, Sweden and Germany who risk retaliation from family members and their immigrant communities as they challenge abusive patriarchal honour-based traditions used to justify violence against women; *Grace, Milly, Lucy...Child Soldiers* (2010), which tells the story of three girls who were abducted and forced into battle for the Lord's Resistance Army in Uganda who are now fighting for peace; and *War Babies* (2002), in which a young man, searching for his roots, hears the atrocious and heartbreaking stories from women of babies born from rape during war.

The Focus On Raymonde Provencher retrospective is supported by K.M. Hunter Charitable Foundation.

With a passion for international affairs that has spanned her decades-long career, Provencher has been celebrated for her bold and honest approach to filmmaking. As a journalist and researcher, she helped launch Télé-Québec's *Nord-Sud* in 1983, which opened a new chapter in international news programming in Quebec, and for which she produced over a hundred reports from across the globe. In 1995 she co-founded the private production company Macumba International, where she worked as a producer on the award-winning films 1973: The Last Stand of Salvador Allende, Images of a Dictatorship and Black Wave.

Committed to uncovering stories about human rights and social injustice issues throughout the world, she began to devote most of her time to scriptwriting and directing in 2000. Provencher worked on the series *Extremis*, where she explored child labour in the Philippines with the film *Lost Childhood* (2000). Her 2002 film *War Babies*, about children born to victims of wartime rape, won four Gémeaux Awards and the Audience Award at the Hot Docs Festival. She followed that with the docs *Une nouvelle vie pour Ramon Mercedes* and *Blue Helmets: Peace and Dishonour*, and 2008's *A Senseless Death* about the Iraq war. In 2009, she co-produced with the NFB *Grace, Milly, Lucy... Child Soldiers*, which tackles the painful tragedy of children forcibly recruited by rebel troops in Uganda. In 2012 and 2015, she directed and produced two films, *Crimes Without Honour* and *Café*



Désirs, and in 2017 presented Torn Apart, a powerful film about forced marriages, which still exist in Quebec.

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HOT DOCS' INTERNATIONAL SPECTRUM COMPETITIVE PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS COMPELLING STORIES FROM COMMUNITIES AROUND THE WORLD

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – This year's International Spectrum program at Hot Docs features world or international premieres of nine feature films and one short. Spotlighting stories captured in unique and interesting ways, this year's International Spectrum program highlights a multitude of important and compelling issues, including female activism and empowerment, negotiating fraught family relationships and the lasting impact of trauma.

"Resonant subjects and creative filmmaking are hallmarks of this year's International Spectrum program," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Featuring nine films and representing 14 countries, the stories presented are personal, poetic and profound, and made by filmmakers that are destined to be among the brightest stars in the documentary world."

World premieres in the International Spectrum program include: *Fadma: Even Ants Have Wings*, which follows a progressive woman who instigates a village-wide cooking strike in a small Berber community in Morocco's mountains; *The Wall of Shadows*, the heartfelt story of a Nepalese Sherpa family that breaks a taboo to desperately earn money for their son's education; and *Women of the Sun: A Chronology of Seeing*, a moving profile of six housewives in an Iranian desert who film their fight for gender equality, higher incomes and personal freedom.

International premieres in the program include: 499, which explores the brutal legacy of colonialism in contemporary Mexico nearly five-hundred years after Cortez conquered the Aztec Empire; All That I Am, which sees a woman return from foster care to live with mother and stepsiblings, having been sexually abused by her now-incarcerated stepfather; Bulletproof, a meditation on fear and safety in the age of school shootings; A Colombian Family, which follows an estranged mother and daughter seeking reconciliation against the backdrop of their country's fraught peace treaty; I Want You If You Dare, an unsentimental and refreshing look at a young woman with cerebral palsy who longs for independence and her first sexual experience; and Stray, a lyrical, beautiful look at stray dogs roaming the streets of Turkey.

The International Spectrum program is supported by the Donner Canadian Foundation.

All feature-length titles in the program are eligible for the Best International Feature Documentary Award and the Special Jury Prize — International Feature Documentary. Emerging directors in the International Spectrum with two or fewer previous feature film credits are also eligible for the Emerging Filmmaker Award.

Hot Docs has been selected as an Academy Award® qualifying festival for feature documentaries. The recipient of Hot Docs' Best International Feature Documentary Award will qualify for consideration in the Documentary Feature Subject category of the Annual Academy Awards® without the standard theatrical run, provided the film otherwise complies with the Academy rules.

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WORLD SHOWCASE PROGRAM FEATURES A THRILLING SURVEY OF DOCUMENTARY FILMS FROM AROUND THE GLOBE

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to spotlight a multitude of global stories in its World Showcase program. Featuring 23 feature films, four mid-lengths and 14 short films, this year's World Showcase includes work from Chile, Kenya, Norway, Mexico, and more.

"Our program featuring the best in global documentary cinema, World Showcase is your entry point to the stories that matter in the world today," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Technology may connect us, but stories unite us, and this program brings together a stunning array of films that show not only the challenges we face, but the many ways we can overcome them."

Stories of families and familial relationships feature prominently in the program, including the international premiere of *Father Soldier Son*, which follows an injured army vet and single father over 10 years as he and his sons navigate life, and *The Earth Is Blue as an Orange*, which looks at the struggles of a single mother living under Russian occupation in the Ukraine who, with her children, creates a film of the surrounding conflict to both understand and transcend their reality.

The lives of seniors are examined in *Zero*, the heartfelt story of a beloved psychiatrist who, set to retire at 82 to care for his ailing wife, leaves his longstanding patients at a loss to build a bond with his replacement, and *The Mole Agent*, a touching observational doc-spy thriller mash-up that follows a Chilean octogenarian who goes undercover at a retirement home to investigate allegations of abuse and theft.

The immigrant experience is explored in *After the Crossing*, which profiles a smooth-talking migrant from Ivory Coast who, after surviving a Libyan prison and a treacherous Mediterranean crossing, struggles to adjust to his new life in Italy, and in the world premiere of *Mein Vietnam*, which looks at a family whose virtual connection to their old lives in Vietnam has prevented them from assimilating into the German community where they've lived for 30 years.

Other incredible stories include: *Mayor*, which tells the story of the charismatic Christian mayor of Ramallah who tends to the everyday needs of his citizens while also striving to end the occupation of Palestine; *Wood*, which goes undercover with an environmental spy operation to expose the trade in illegal timber by infiltrating a global syndicate working in remote Russian forests, Chinese factories and Romanian mills; and *Landfall*, an eye-opening look at Puerto Rico after 2017's hurricane Maria devasted the US territory, exposing the political systems that failed to step in to help the fallen people.

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FILMS IN NEW *REVISIONARIES* PROGRAM OFFER REFLECTIONS ON THE PAST TO MOVE FORWARD INTO THE FUTURE

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to announce Revisionaries, a new theme program that offers stories that provide new lenses on the past that inform how to envision the future. These seven feature films and eight shorts delve into intimate and personal histories, as well as take wider, more expansive looks at complex stories and issues.

"A deeply thoughtful program, Revisionaries features personal and political stories that allow us to reimagine the future, by carefully examining the past," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "By taking another look, from a different perspective, these films show us new versions of stories we thought we knew, alongside those we've never seen before."

Personal histories reexamined in the program include: *Finding Sally*, which tells the story of the filmmaker's aunt, an idealistic aristocrat-turned-communist-rebel with the Ethiopian People's Revolutionary Party who disappeared during the revolution's tumultuous aftermath. A tender celebration of life and family, *Dick Johnson Is Dead* offers a lighter take on the passing of a parent as filmmaker Kirsten Johnson and her father Dick, who is suffering from the early stages of dementia, reenact possible death scenes for the camera. An exploration of the transformative power of parenting and our emotional attachment to "stuff", the world premiere of *Love & Stuff* shows us how filmmaker Judith Helfand mourns the recent loss of her mother through a connection with her things while preparing to be a "new old" mom at 50; and the world premiere of *AKA Jane Roe* shares the unbelievable deathbed confession of Norma McCorvey, the real life "Jane Roe" from the landmark US *Roe v. Wade* abortion rights case.

Films that turn new lenses on broader social and political history include: *The Art of Fallism*, where you'll meet the artists and activists of The Fallist movement in Capetown who want to revolutionize the country from its Apartheid roots and reclaim their culture; *Zlota Street*, in which a Polish Jew and his wife reclaim their history after inheriting a tenement that was within the walls of the Warsaw ghetto during WWII; and *Socialism*, *An American Story*, an examination of the stigmatized ideology's history in America and its relevance today as told through the stories of two people from opposite sides of the country who turn to it to find their footing.

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NEW THEME PROGRAM TO CONSERVE AND PROTECT SHARES FASCINATING STORIES THAT REFLECT ON HUMANKIND'S RELATIONSHIP WITH NATURE

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to announce To Conserve and Protect, a new theme program that travels to the edges of this beautiful planet to discover histories and untold stories of people fighting for, and collaborating with, the natural world. With six feature films, *To Conserve and Protect* strives to understand the role humankind needs to play in maintaining and protecting the Earth and all its inhabitants.

"To Conserve and Protect shines a light on stories that connect us with the natural world," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Through protest, investigation and sometimes just listening, the films in this program take us on journeys into our relationship with nature that will help us reframe the way we engage with the planet."

The program offers three outstanding world premieres: *Borealis* goes deep into the heart of the mysterious boreal snow forest, observing it from diverse perspectives—from that of foragers and Indigenous healers to biologists and loggers—to gain a greater understanding of this natural wonder; *Cane Fire* dives into Hawaii's sugar cane industry, tracing the island's social history—and the various strategies by which Hollywood has represented it—to create a complex portrait of the struggles of native and working-class residents; and *First We Eat*, which transports audiences to Dawson City, Yukon, where filmmaker Suzanne Crocker eliminates all store-bought food from her home and challenges her family to eat locally for one full year.

Rounding out the program is the international premiere of *Akicita: The Battle of Standing Rock*, a detailed account of the Dakota Access Pipeline stand-off where young Native warriors led the charge to protect the land and water; *My Octopus Teacher*, which follows the remarkable story of a free diver who befriends a curious octopus while swimming off the tip of Africa; and *Once Upon a Time in Venezuela*, which reveals the environmental suffering of Congo Mirador, a small fishing village in Venezuela that is literally sinking from sedimentation.

But the tables turn when his victims team up with a female bounty hunter to get revenge and serve justice.

The international premiere of *City So Real* by Oscar-nominated director Steve James (*Hoop Dreams*) is a fascinating and complex portrait of contemporary Chicago, and a multifaceted look into the soul of a quintessentially American city set against the backdrop of its history-making 2019 mayoral election.

The North American premiere of *Green Blood* follows a consortium of 40 global journalists who've banded together to continue the work of local reporters who've been threatened, jailed or killed because they were investigating the large-scale crimes committed by mining behemoths—including Canada's own Barrick—in India, Guatemala and Tanzania.

PERSISTER PROGRAM RETURNS WITH INSPIRING STORIES OF FEMALE EMPOWERMENT

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – Hot Docs is pleased to announce that the popular theme program Persister returns to this year's Festival program. Consisting of 10 features and six shorts, the program spotlights an array of strong, inspirational female voices speaking up and being heard, and fighting for what they believe in.

"The outspoken and outstanding subjects featured in this year's Persister program refused to be defined by limitations, whether societal, personal or patriarchal," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "Featuring powerful, creative portraits of women working to make a difference—for themselves, their communities, their world—this collection of female-driven and directed films will leave you energized and inspired."

The struggle of women to both succeed in the business world and to confront the biases that world imposes are starkly seen in two films. The world premiere of *Lady Buds* profiles six savvy businesswomen excited to break into California's newly legal cannabis trade. But as corporate megagrows displace artisanal independents and excessive regulations aren't applied equally, their optimism is replaced with uncertainty and fear. The international premiere of *The Dilemma of Desire* takes a hard look at the medical industry that has all but ignored female pleasure through the stories of four different women left to discover their bodies on their own.

Musical trailblazers are featured in *Shut Up Sona*, an inspiring look at Indian singer Sona Mohapatra, a feisty feminist who's using her voice to fight back against misogyny and to create a space for herself in India's patriarchal music industry that denies her value; and in the Crave Original Documentary *FANNY: The Right to Rock*, which tells the enthralling untold story of a 1970s Filipina-American garage band that morphed into the ferocious rock group Fanny, who are now on a comeback.

Stories of women fighting for control of their own bodies are found in the world premiere of $\it The 8^{th}$, which reveals how the pro-choice movement overturned conservative Ireland's strict 35-year antiabortion ban by switching tactics to emphasize compassion; and in $\it Breaking the Silence$, which tells the story of an Indigenous women who, after learning the truth of her own genital mutilation, now joins forces with other Indigenous women in Colombia to end the inhumane practice.

New looks at motherhood are seen in the world premieres of *Her Mothers*, which shares the intimate story of a lesbian couple adopting a child against the backdrop of rising homophobia in Hungary; and *The School of Housewives*, which takes audiences inside The Reykjavík School of Housewives. Known for teaching students cooking, cleaning, sewing and home economics since 1942, the school stands as a timeless reminder that the domestic arts of the past are as applicable now as they were then. A hand-crafted and slyly feminist love letter to "women's work" that breathes new life into making, sharing and caring for how things look and taste.

With prominent themes exploring family, relationships and the strength gained from them, the program includes eight feature films, one mid-length and five shorts.

"For a third year, Hot Docs is honoured to partner with EFP to present a selection of documentaries offering unique perspectives and engaging stories that give us a glimpse of a Europe in transition," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "The program also introduces us to the talent behind the camera, skilled filmmakers destined to make their mark on the documentary world."

The Changing Face of Europe continues EFP's commitment of presenting outstanding creative documentaries from Europe to North American audiences. Filmmakers selected to take part in this program will also participate in a number of online industry market activities, expanding their professional development on an international scale, and increasing their film's access to North American and international markets.

"We are very happy to continue our partnership with Hot Docs despite these difficult times, and to be able to offer the filmmakers who have been selected for The Changing Face Of Europe the opportunity to share their films digitally with key distributors, buyers and festival programmers, and later in the year, in front of Toronto's enthusiastic audiences," said EFP's Managing Director **Sonja Heinen**.

The goal of EFP is to raise visibility and market opportunities for unique, strong and visionary documentaries from Europe. Since 2017, it has provided Film Sales Support for European world sales companies to market films selected for Hot Docs, increasing Europe's presence at the Festival and helping to stimulate distribution of European films to North America and beyond.

This year's program features the international premiere of *Two Roads*, about Czech rock band The Tap Tap, whose members live with physical and neurological disabilities, but still party hard and own the rock star lifestyle.

The Polish film *Lessons of Love* follows the free-spirited Jola after she escapes her abusive marriage. Letting loose with her friends and finding herself in a new romance, the film is a joyful journey into a woman's battle to reinvent herself at 69 years old.

Dead Souls' Vacation from Georgia shows us the life of once popular bass player Tbilisi, who is now jobless and living in a small one-bedroom apartment with his elderly mother. It is an intimately absurd slice of post-Soviet life that provides an astute look at one family's dysfunction.

The international premiere of Denmark's *Reunited* reveals how the Syrian war split one family across three continents—a father in Canada and his two children in Turkey—and their formidable fight to reunite.



With stunning visuals, Iceland's nostalgic *The Last Autumn* takes us to a remote sheep farm bordering the Arctic Ocean that is facing its final season. After centuries of rural tradition, we watch as Farmer Úlfar, the last in a long line of farmers, accepts that his traditional way of life is coming to an end.

A Pleasure, Comrades! is a Portuguese film that takes us back to 1975, when many European foreigners came to post-Carnation Revolution Portugal to assist in newly formed co-ops. Today, the aging men and women return to play-act their memories, celebrating sexual freedom and hedonistic utopia.

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HOT DOCS' REDUX PROGRAM SPOTLIGHTS TRAILBLAZING REVOLUTIONARIES

Toronto, April 14, 2020 — Hot Docs is pleased to announce films in Redux: Revolution, a twist on the popular retrospective program that shares exceptional documentaries from the past. This year's program focuses on stories of revolution, featuring subjects who have pushed back against injustice and oppressive societal norms, and fought against corrupt governments, corporate greed and the abuse of power.

"This year Redux highlights the theme of revolution," said **Kiva Reardon**, programmer of the Redux program. "Varying in forms, eras and locales, the idea behind Redux: Revolution is to celebrate films that, while coming from a specific time and place, speak to the urgency of the present and the desire to work towards a better future."

This year's Redux program includes *The Boxing Girls of Kabul*, an award-winning film by Ariel Nasr, whose doc *The Forbidden Reel* is also part of this year's Artscapes program. The film is a dynamic profile of the Afghan women's boxing team as they face multiple challenges that range from lack of equipment to threats from the Taliban.

One of the most widely screened films of the NFB's Indian Film Crew initiative, *You Are on Indian Land* documents the 1969 uprising of the Kanien'kéhaka (Mohawk) of Akwesasne territory on the Canada-US border, which mobilized a new generation of Indigenous resistance movements. *An African Election* tells the story of Ghana's momentous 2008 election, as filmmaker Jarreth Mertz captures the fervour of campaigning and the anxious mood of voters as their democracy perilously strains through the turbulent process.

Redux: Revolution features filmmaker Jocelyne Saab's three short films *Beirut, My City; Beirut, Never Again*; and *Children of War*, an intensely powerful chronicle about the director's experience with the Siege of Beirut and the outbreak of the Lebanese Civil War. Also in the program is *The Reluctant Revolutionary*, which looks at the 2011 revolt in Yemen through the eyes of Kais, a funny and charismatic local who wants nothing to do with the conflict, until he's drawn in.

This year, the Redux program also includes a memorial screening honouring Hot Docs award-winning director John Kastner, who passed away in November 2019. His film *Rage Against the Darkness: Bunny and Leona* is a beautiful film about old age, family and the transitions we must make in life told through the story of two elderly sisters forced to live apart for the first time in 30 years.

Toronto, April 14, 2020 – The Hot Docs Board of Directors is pleased to announce it has chosen multi-award-winning director and producer Stanley Nelson as the recipient of its 2020 Outstanding Achievement Award.

"We're honoured to recognize Stanley Nelson, one of the documentary world's most important voices, with the Hot Docs Outstanding Achievement Award, and to feature a selection of films from Stanley's impressive body of work," said **Shane Smith**, director of programming for Hot Docs. "His contribution to documentary is unprecedented, with his powerful films providing incisive commentary on the African American experience, while restoring his subjects to their rightful place in history."

Films included in Stanley Nelson's Outstanding Achievement Award retrospective include *Freedom Summer* (2014), which takes the viewer back to Mississippi in 1964 at the height of the civil rights movement; 2005's *Sweet Honey in the Rock: Raise Your Voice*, which looks into the world of the Grammy-winning all-women a cappella group Sweet Honey in the Rock; 2015's *Black Panthers: Vanguard of the Revolution*, a definitive look at the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense; last year's Festival favourite *Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool*, a captivating profile on the legendary jazz musician. Also, as part of the honour Mr. Nelson is given the opportunity to select a film to screen in the retrospective that complements or has inspired his own body of work. Mr. Nelson's has selected Raoul Peck's *I Am Not Your Negro*, which is based on an unfinished James Baldwin manuscript that explores the history of racism in America.

With a dense catalogue of thought-provoking documentaries chronicling the African American experience, Stanley Nelson is a celebrated filmmaker many times over. A MacArthur "Genius" Fellow, he received an individual Peabody Award in 2015 for his work, and the 2016 Lifetime Achievement Award from the National Academy of Television Arts Sciences. He was awarded the National Medal in the Humanities from President Barack Obama, and his films *Freedom Riders* (2010) and *Freedom Summer* (2014), which look at multiracial efforts to register black voters and desegregate public transportation facilities in the Jim Crow South, received high praise, with the former awarded three primetime Emmy Awards and the latter earning Nelson a Peabody Award.

Combining compelling narratives with rich and deeply researched historical detail, Nelson's films have shone new light on both familiar and under-explored aspects of the American past. Two of his recent films, *Tell Them We Are Rising: The Story of Black Colleges and Universities* (2018) which chronicles the 150-year history and impact of historic black colleges and universities, and *The Black Panthers: Vanguard of the Revolution* (2016), a portrait of the iconic Black Panther organization, broke audience records for African American viewership on the PBS series Independent Lens and won the 2016 NAACP Image Award for Outstanding Documentary Film.

His 2003 film *The Murder of Emmett Till*, about the brutal killing of a fourteen-year-old African American boy in Mississippi in 1955, received the Sundance Special Jury Prize that year, and his



latest film, *Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool*, premiered at Sundance in 2019, marking Nelson's tenth premiere at the prestigious festival in 20 years, the most of any documentary filmmaker.

In 2000, Nelson and his wife, Marcia A. Smith, founded Firelight Media, a non-profit production company dedicated to telling underrepresented stories, and to mentoring, inspiring and training a new generation of talented documentary filmmakers of color. Firelight received a MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions in 2016.

The Hot Docs Outstanding Achievement Award is presented annually by the Hot Docs Board of Directors in recognition of a filmmaker's enduring contribution to the documentary form.

The film tells the harrowing tale of four Cuban baseball players and their dangerous journeys out of their homeland and into the United States.



ELLE-MAIJA TAILFEATHERS

Elle-Máijá Tailfeathers is a filmmaker, writer, and actor. She is Niitsitapi (Blackfoot) from the Kainai First Nation (Blood Reserve) as well as Sámi from northern Norway. Tailfeathers was the 2018 Sundance Institute Merata Mita Film Fellow and is an alumnus of the Berlinale Talent Lab, the Hot Docs Accelerator Lab, the CFC/NFB/Ford Foundation Open Immersion Virtual Reality Lab, the Whistler Film Festival Aboriginal Film Fellowship, and the International Sámi Film Institute Indigenous Film Fellowship. Her short documentary *Bihttoš* was included in the TIFF Top Ten Canadian Shorts and was also nominated for a Canadian Screen Award and a Leo Award for Best Short Documentary. Her narrative feature-length directorial debut *The Body Remembers When the World Broke Open*, co-written and co-directed with Kathleen Hepburn, premiered at the Berlin International Film Festival in the Generation Program and won numerous awards including both the Toronto and Vancouver Film Critics Best Canadian Feature Award. She is currently directing a feature-length documentary about the opiate crisis in her home community of Kainai with the support of the National Film Board of Canada as well as the Hot Docs Cross Currents Fund.
